

Tina Segura joined the CLRC as a staff attorney with Disability Rights Legal Center's Cancer Legal Resource Center (CLRC) in 2015. As CLRC staff attorney, Ms. Segura researches cancer-related legal issues, providing information and resources to people affected by cancer through the telephone assistance line. Ms. Segura also conducts cancer-related legal trainings to health care professionals and people with cancer, throughout the country and helps supervise CLRC student volunteers.

Ms. Segura received her B.A. in Applied Behavioral Sciences from National-Louis University in Chicago, Illinois, then earned her Juris Doctorate from Pepperdine School of Law, where she served as vice president of Pepperdine's Advocates for Public Interest Law program. She also went to work at Paz y Esperanza in Peru, assisting attorneys in the investigation of sexual and domestic abuse cases. After graduation, prior to joining the CLRC, Ms. Segura worked at Mental Health Advocacy Services, helping low income individuals with mental health disabilities.

Ms. Segura likes to spend her free time on outdoor adventures such as surfing, kayaking, and backpacking. She is an active volunteer of the Surfrider Foundation, serving as executive committee chairperson of one of the California chapters, tackling environmental issues that affect the West LA / Malibu area.
